### Answers



1. How did St. Nicholas enter the house?

Accept answers which state that he came down the chimney.



2. 'his clothes were all tarnished with ashes...'
In this sentence, what does 'tarnished' mean?

Accept answers which state that tarnished means dirtied, ruined, marked or damaged.



3. Why do you think the author described his nose as 'like a cherry'?

Accept answers which state that this description tells the reader about the round shape of his nose or the bright red colour.



4. What do you think is going to happen in the next few verses of the poem?

Accept any reasonable prediction which could logically happen in the poem, such as St Nicholas introducing himself, St Nicholas leaving the presents beneath the tree or him brushing the dust off his suit.
