




Kingfisher Class News and Homework

Maths: This week we have begun learning about 2D shapes. We have looked at their properties and used these to describe them to others. We have also been classifying triangles and quadrilaterals (shapes with 4 sides). Following this, we looked at recognising and indentifying angles found in shapes. We have learnt that an angle is a measure of a turn and discovered that each quarter turn is a right angle or 90° .



Angles smaller than a right angle are called acute angles and angles larger than a right angle but smaller than 180° are known as obtuse.

English: I n English we have continued our work on 'Float and have been focussing on using fronted adverbials, personification and high quality vocabulary. We have also looked at organising our sentences into paragraphs to make it clearer for the reader to understand. We created and performed a rainstorm using physical actions initially and then we thought about onomatopoeic words and put these into a rainstorm. Look at our twitter page to see our performance.

Topic: We have been researching major rivers of the world this week and collecting information about them: continent they are in, length etc. Continuing with the journey of a river we have created art work using collage techniques to show the different stages in the rivers journey.



Science: In science, we are finishing our Animals including Humans topic by undertaking a group quiz to test our knowledge and preparing presentations to show what we have understood about our muscles, bones exercise and healthy eating.
