Maths: This week we have continued our work on counting in multiples. We have been applying our knowledge to help us solve problems including reasoning. We discovered it is quite difficult to explain how and why the problem was solved. We have also used equipment to help us understand place value and the Year 4's have looked at negative numbers.

English: We have finished writing our class version of 'The Flood' and have planned our own version. Some of us have started to write up our own stories, 'magpieing' many of our fantastic sentences we wrote for the original story 'The Flood' in our own versions. Of course we need to check through our work and practise using the dictionary to check our spellings.



Topic: We have been using books and the internet to research what life is like for the tribes that live in the rainforest. We have been learning how to take notes to help us make information pages. In our groups we are creating posters to show all the information we have collected.

Science: This week we continued learning about how different surfaces reflect light. We then wrote our own explanations about how our periscopes work and what they would be useful for.

Homework Task:

You are going on a journey through the Rainforest. It will be hot, and treacherous. It will be full of exotic creatures and maybe you might get to meet an as yet, 'unreached' tribe. Design a camp and think about the equipment, food, water, home-comforts and items you might need to live while you away.
