| <b>Impact of the support provided by Pupil Premium funding</b>  |         |
| As a result of the interventions provided by pupil premium funding, pupils have made good progress and gaps in attainment narrowed. With such small numbers of pupil's eligible for the funding, some of whom have other complex problems; it can be problematic to describe impact in terms of percentages without identifying individual pupils. However, all pupils have benefitted academically and socially from the support provided. For most pupils, progress has been at least in line with expectations. Booster sessions and small group support with Teaching Assistants and/or teachers has supported achievement e.g. at the end of Year 6. |         |
