Key Concepts		2	Prophet Someone who prophesises. Often an outsider, making pronouncements and judgements about how the Jews were living
The Trinity	Christians believe that God is Trinity: God is three in one- God the Creator and Father, the Son and Saviour and the Holy Spirit and comforter. God is the same throughout. Christianity is distinctive to other religions because of belief in the Trinity.	3	Prophecy Foretelling of the future
Incarnation	The prophecies in Isaiah tell of a baby who would be called 'God with us'. This follows the idea, that Jesus is actually God incarnate (i.e. in human form) and is what Christians believe.	4	Incarnation God in human form

Jesus Christ	The Messiah, The 'anointed one', God incarnate	6	God the Father The God who created the earth and all within it
