**Intent - On behalf of pupils of all levels of ability in PE and Sport:**

- Provide high quality teaching and learning in PE and Sport at Clipston School.
- Increase pupils' engagement with physical activity.
- Provide a range of PE and sporting activities and experiences.
- Support teacher's and teaching assistant's professional learning in Real PE and Sport.
- Facilitate co-ordination of PE and Sport events, particularly competitive sports with other schools.
- Provide release time for to the PE Lead to organise and co-ordinate Sports Partnership events.

**Implementation – How do we intend to spend the Sport Grant?**

- Resources for Sports use - £412
- Deliver a range of additional sporting events and opportunities £2,641
- Daventry District Sports Partnership Membership - £1,350
- Staff Training & PE Conference - £85
- Sports Expenses including Sports Crew, Change4Life, Sports Co-ordination and Clubs – £6,643
- Transport costs - £60

**Total spend for Financial Year 2020 - 2021 = £ 11,205**

**Amount carried forward to 2021-2022 (due to Covid) = £7,566**

**Impact – What has been the benefit of the Sports Grant?**

- The PE and Sports funding has contributed to the provision of high quality Sport at Clipston School and opportunities for all pupils, regardless of their ability in sport.
- A very wide range of sport experiences additional to the timetabled day are being offered.
- Participation Trackers show that many more children are accessing these opportunities.
- Participation in both competitive and non-competitive sport opportunities is high.
- Staff have been upskilled in the theory of Real PE.
- The school has a dedicated member of staff to co-ordinate the sporting events.
- The lunch-time clubs have improved pupils' engagement in structured physical activity.
- Pupil Sports Crew Leaders are enthusiastic and children are developing leadership and organisational skills.
- Opportunities are provided to ensure that children are learning about how to be healthy.
- Children enthusiastically participate in cluster sporting competitions and events, although these have been curtailed somewhat this year, due to Covid. These have an impact on levels of self-confidence and self-esteem, which in turn contributes to improving levels of achievement across the curriculum.
- At the last Daventry School Sports Awards, Clipston was nominated and Highly commended for Sports Crew of the Year, Active School of the Year and one of our SEN pupils was runner up in the Primary Sports Star of the Year.
- The school has retained its Sainsbury's Gold Sports Award.
- Of the 8 pupils in Year 6, 75% could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m. 75% could use a range of strokes effectively, and 75% could perform safe self-rescue.
