



Clipston Primary School – Event Calendar

<p>Welcome to Clipston Primary School. The following Event Calendar may be useful for all parents, but particularly to those families new to Clipston School, in order to have an overview of the school year. The list below does not cover all the events that take place, but those listed usually take place every year. The details of these events and others (including sports events, The Y5&6 Residential, class trips and visitors) that take during the year are given – usually at least two months in advance – via our weekly newsletter, which is sent to parents by email every Friday. <p>Harvest Festival All Saints Church, Clipston Most Parents/carers attend. We usually support our link school in India (through our longstanding support of the charity Children United www.childrenunited.btck.co.uk) and a local food bank.</p>	<p>9.15am - usually on a Tuesday during the last week of September / first week of October depending on the availability of the vicar.</p>
<p>Individual Photographs Parents/carers do not attend. We do however offer photos with pre-school siblings, between 8.45-9.00am, if you would like to bring your younger children.</p>	<p>Usually in early October from 8.45am</p>
<p>Enrichment Day Parents/carers do not attend. All the children across the whole school work together on a range of activities, which are designed to enrich the curriculum. The day is sponsored by the School Association.</p>	<p>Three times a year, around half-term.</p>
<p>Autumn Parent Consultations Parents/carers are required to make an appointment to discuss their child’s progress and attainment with the class teacher. The children are not required to attend, although you can bring them with you if you are not using a baby-sitter.</p>	<p>Twice a year: before October half-term and again in March. Usually from 1.30pm on Monday for EYFS to Year 2, and from 1.30pm on Wednesdays for KS2 and on both Monday and Wednesdays from 3.30pm until about 7pm for all children.</p>
<p>Awards Assembly Parents/carers do not attend but are invited to send in any nominations for Gold Awards via the school office email. Awards are made for a variety of achievements such as passing a music or dance exam, moving up a grade at swimming or other sports club, achieving a Rainbows, Brownies, Beavers or Cubs badge, community enterprise e.g. fundraising or litter-picking and for accolades such as being awarded Blue Peter Badges or an exceptional effort resulting in an achievement, as well as for progress or an exceptional act in school. The House Cup is also awarded, plus any school sports certificates.</p>	<p>Six times a year, just before or just after a school holiday.</p>
<p>School Calendar Photos – organised by the School Association – a traditional fundraiser for the school. Parents/carers do not attend.</p>	<p>Usually towards the end of October, depending on the volunteers from the School Association.</p>
<p>Secondary School Application Deadline The date by which parents of children in Year 6 must have submitted their on-line application.</p>	<p>Usually the end of October</p>
<p>Swimming The KS2 children take in in turns to attend weekly swimming lessons between October half-term and Easter.</p>	<p>Usually on a Friday morning.</p>
<p>Reading / Phonics Information Evening</p>	<p>An evening - 6.00pm – in October or November</p>



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<p>All parents/carers are invited to attend to gain a better understand of how we teach Reading / Phonics and to glean information about how to support learning at home.</p>	
<p>Children In Need The pupil-led School Council will usually organise a fundraising opportunity to support Children in Need e.g. a cake bake, and all families are encouraged to take part.</p>	<p>Usually the second Friday in November</p>
<p>Life Education Bus This supports our Health Education curriculum. Parents/carers are welcome to attend the Parent Session. Further information can be found at (www.coram.org.uk) Children will attend their own Year Group sessions which are led by the trained Life Education Staff.</p>	<p>The Parent Session is usually at the beginning or the end of a school day. The Life Education Bus usually visits in the autumn term.</p>
<p>Infant Nativity This usually takes place in the school hall. Almost all parents/cares attend. Tickets are allocated (3 per family) and parents arrange for someone to collect them from the school office.</p>	<p>There are usually two performances at 11am and 2pm – usually during the second week in December.</p>
<p>Assembly to celebrate Christingle – Led by the vicar at All Saints Church, Clipston for the Infant children. Parents/carers are welcome to attend.</p>	<p>This is usually during the first week in December.</p>
<p>Christmas Bazaar – traditional annual fundraiser organised by the School Association. Almost all parents arrange for a family representative to collect their child/ren at 1.30pm and accompany them around the Bazaar. If you are unable to send a representative, the school will allocate a member of staff to your child.</p>	<p>This takes place in school, usually on the first Friday in December, 1.30pm until 3.30pm.</p>
<p>Flu Immunisations Parents/Carers do not attend</p>	<p>These sessions are arranged by the School Health Team – usually in the autumn term.</p>
<p>Junior Carol Concert @ All Saints Church Everyone is welcome to attend events in church. Most KS2 parents/carers attend this traditional event.</p>	<p>Evening – 6.00pm – usually the last week of term. Children return to school at 5.30pm, to walk over with staff to the church.</p>
<p>Whole School Pantomime It has been a tradition for many years to take the whole school to watch a pantomime. Parents do not attend.</p>	<p>This usually takes place during the last two weeks of the autumn term.</p>
<p>School Christmas Disco This is organised by the School Association. Parents do not attend, although the School Association would be pleased if parents could volunteer to help.</p>	<p>This takes place during the school day in the school hall, usually towards the end of term.</p>
<p>Kingswood Christmas Lunch The majority of staff and many children enjoy a traditional Christmas Lunch, served by the staff. Parents do not attend.</p>	<p>This takes place during December. The school is allocated a day by Kingswood Caterers.</p>

World Book Day We usually participate in World Book Day activities such as bringing in a favourite book/wearing pyjamas to promote bedtime reading etc. Parents do not attend.	Usually on the first Thursday in March.
Comic Relief – Red Nosed Day The pupil-led School Council will usually organise a fundraising opportunity to support Red Nose Day e.g. a cake bake and all families are encouraged to take part.	A Friday in mid-March
Whole Class Photos Parents/carers do not attend.	During the school day, usually in March.
Easter Service - All Saints Church Most parents/carers attend this traditional Service which is led by the children.	Usually the last day of the spring Term at 9.15am
Summer Term	
School May Fete This traditional fundraising event is organised by the School Association. Most families attend.	Saturday – late morning until mid-afternoon – usually the Saturday before the last week of Term 5.
Sports Day The Infants compete first, collecting points for their House Team. The Juniors then compete in traditional races. The House Sports Cup is awarded. Most parents/carers attend.	This usually takes place at Clipston Recreational Ground on a Friday afternoon in June. Two dates are arranged on the school calendar in case it rains on the first date. Very occasionally, a third date is arranged if both the first two dates are rained off.
Transition Morning The children spend the morning with the children they will be in class with in September. The new Reception entrants joins us. Parents do not attend.	This usually takes place on the first Monday in July to link in with Guilsborough Secondary School's Transition Day.
Year 5&6 Play The Year 5&6 children perform in a play. Almost all parents/carers attend.	School Hall - there is usually an afternoon and an evening performance on two consecutive days in July.
EYFS End of Year Celebration All parents/carers of Reception children attend.	This takes place on an afternoon in July, in the Owl's Classroom.
Leavers' Service – in All Saints' Church This is a special service to celebrate our Year 6 leavers. Everyone is always welcome to attend church, but this event is mainly attended by Year 6 parents.	Usually on the penultimate day of the summer term at 9.15am.
