### Our School Uniform

In order to instil high standards of behaviour and good attitudes to learning, the Board of Governors has adopted the following School Uniform Policy. All items can be easily purchased from any high street store, except for the school tie, PE Bag and Bookbag.



## **The School Uniform consists of:**

Grey Trousers / Shorts / Skirt / Pinafore

Sensible black shoes that can be polished. Sensible black boots may be worn in winter.

Dark grey or black socks, red or grey tights.

Red V-necked jumper / cardigan (not a fleece, sweatshirt or hoodie)

White collared shirt - to be worn tucked in

School Tie – with logo

**Between Easter and October half-term**, pupils may wear a red gingham summer dress with white socks.

Hair bands and clips should be of sensible size and reflect the school colours of red / grey / black / white.

## **PE Kit**

Black shorts

Red T-shirt

Black plimsolls

In colder months, children will need Black or Grey joggers & sweatshirt or tracksuit with Trainers

Long hair must be tied back

Children are required to wear a hat when they have their swimming lessons. Goggles are not generally allowed.

**Jewellery is to be limited to one pair of earlobe studs - these must be removed by the child during PE and swimming. Make up, including nail varnish is not allowed.**

All children will require a Bookbag, a School Tie and a P.E. Bag – these must be purchased from the school office.
